




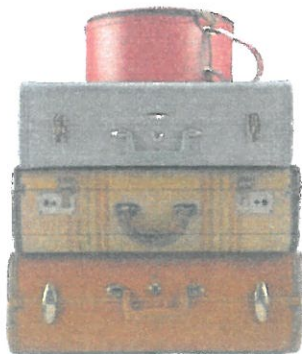

Vicar's Letter

Dear friends

Last month we included with your Barton Miller, a questionnaire about our plans to replace St Mary's church room, and I am delighted that many people have already taken the time to respond. If you haven't yet done so, there is still time, and if you have mislaid your questionnaire we have plenty of spare copies in the church porch.

Judging from the responses we have so far, people in Barton Mills are a friendly lot and are keen on ideas for getting people together more – the suggestion of a coffee drop-in is particularly popular, as are community lunches and the idea of a 'manned' church office. One respondent pointed out that the church is already a meeting place, which is of course true: in some ways we simply want to do what we do already, only more and better.

Getting people together, or providing places for them to get themselves together, is more important than you might think: a recent study has shown that loneliness and social isolation are as bad for your health as smoking 15 cigarettes per day. It's a particular risk for the elderly who live alone, though it can and does affect people of any age. Yet it is a very modern problem, perhaps because so much of our modern way of life tends to make us do things alone.

When my parents were young no-one had a car, so people would walk or catch the bus together; they lived near to where they worked, and tended to know their work-mates as neighbours as well. It was much more common back then for people to live in extended families, with the different generations caring for each other. Even small villages had local corner shops where you could catch up with the latest gossip, and no-one bothered to close the front door – it was expected that people would pop in and out of their houses to say hello or to borrow something. It's all very different now, even in a lovely village like Barton Mills. We tend to live more private, separate lives, and when we do meet we don't always really get to know each other deeply.

It's interesting that according to the bible, the first thing God said was Not Good after making the world was for man to be alone – so he made him a companion. In the words of the song, 'Everybody needs somebody sometimes' – it's true, isn't it?

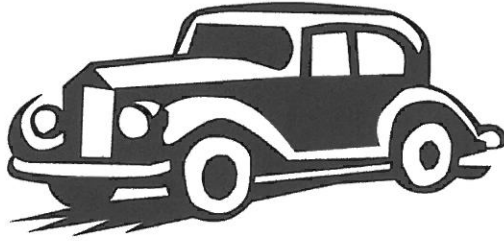
There will not be a September Barton Miller, as several members of the volunteer team who regularly produce the Barton Miller are not available at the end of August.

August will see **hundreds of the world's best athletes** will be performing at the **Olympic Games in Brazil**. It's taken them perhaps years of practice to get them to the peak of condition. Many hours of **patience, pain and loneliness** have been experienced and sacrifices have been endured. Some of them may only reach the first round of their event; only **few will attain their goal and win a gold, silver or bronze medal**, however, **all will have run the race of their lives** and have taken part in one of the world's largest sporting events. “

We are in the **race of life** and we hit many walls of **pain, loneliness, abuse, hopelessness and sadness** but if we, like Paul tells us in Hebrews 12 v 1 and 2 “**run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus**”, we shall overcome. Running the **Christian race is not always easy**. 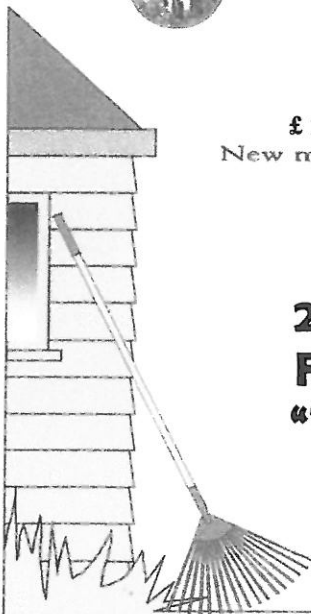

Welcome to the regular new page for the Trust, where we hope not just to keep you reminded of current events but also to share snippets from the history of the Church.

The Mural of the Good Shepherd



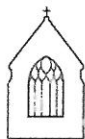
Over the Chancel arch you will of course have seen the mural of The Good Shepherd, one of the many outstanding features of St. Mary's. This was completed in 1911, and the parish records show that £12 16s 6d was paid to "G. Gilbert Scott, Architect, for designs, travelling, and other expenses." Another £65 was paid to "Messrs. James Powell & Sons, for painting on Chancel arch wall."

The mural itself is comprised of tempera paint that is stenciled on. Stenciling was a form of art that rose to popularity for church decoration in tandem with the Gothic Revival style of design, with the mid 1800s architect AWN Pugin having enormous influence. His published works, including sample stencils and designs, inspired other architects throughout the Victorian and Edwardian periods. These included George Gilbert Scott and, subsequently, his son Giles Gilbert Scott – eventual designer of the painting in St. Mary's. James Powell & Sons, also known as Whitefriars Glass, were a prominent firm in the Victorian and Edwardian periods. Despite their name, their expertise extended beyond the design, manufacture, and installation of stained glass windows, and this is no doubt why they were selected to execute Giles Gilbert Scott's stenciled painting of The Good Shepherd here in Barton Mills.

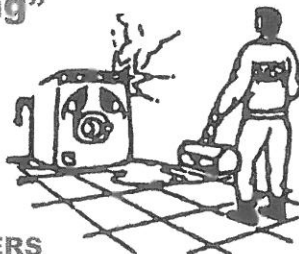

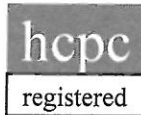
